Introduction on Economics Problems Of The Population In Few Villages:

At present, the condition of the life of the people living in villages is gloomy. The problems of our villagers are many and varied. The villagers are poor, ignorant and superstitious. Most of the villages have no basic amenities like good roads, schools and hospitals. The condition of village schools is not satisfactory. Moreover, the villagers don't understand the importance of education. A large number of children are engaged in economic activities, mainly agriculture. They do not know the laws of health.

Their numbers have been rising rapidly because of the natural increase in population and depeasantization. These workers depend on seasonal demand for labour in agriculture and in rural informal, small-scale industries and services. The landless rural workers are vulnerable to fluctuations in the demand for labour, wage rates, and food prices. They find it even more difficult than small landowners and tenants to gain access to public infrastructure and services. In addition, unlike their counterparts in urban areas, they are often excluded from public sector safety nets (food rations, for example).

Rural areas that lose population face a number of problems. One is a shrinking workforce, making it more difficult for businesses to find workers who match their needs. Another problem is that of an aging population with an increasing need for health services, the provision of which is already a struggle as rural hospitals and other care facilities close.

Then there is the problem of a shrinking tax base, which puts pressure on government budgets to fund essential services, such as infrastructure and public schools, that may help attract businesses and workers. In short, as people leave, the people and businesses that remain are generally worse off.

More recently, rural population loss has become more acute. Between 2010 and 2016, rural areas lost population in absolute terms for the first time. In the past, natural increase more than compensated for the number of people moving from rural areas to urban areas. But declines in the number of births and increases in mortality rates for some rural populations have contributed to a bleaker population outlook for rural communities.

ABOUT SOCIO-ECONOMIC SURVEY

Introduction About The Socio-Economic Survey:

A Community Service Project Survey Done On "ECONOMICS PROBLEMS OF THE POPULATION IN UPPALAPADU IS A SMALL VILLAGE IN GUNTUR DISTRICT ANDHRA PRADESH"

In the survey I observed mainly issues in Uppalapadu is a revenue division with a population of 6,175, has been waiting for provision of safe drinking water to their village for the past two years. The only source of drinking and irrigation water to the village was the local pond, which became a haven for migratory birds.

By doing survey on Uppalapadu village they still face constraints such as access to education, health facilities, drinking water, power, roads, credit, information and market. Against this background, adoption of villages especially in backward regions and a long way in ensuring holistic and integrated development of the villages concerned. They are facing some economic factors factors like mainly in health, finance, social, education, etc.

There is a Bird Sanctuary is located in Uppalapadu. Painted storks, spot-billed pelicans and other birds that migrate from various countries such as Serbia and Australia flock to the Uppalapadu Bird Sanctuary between the months of September and February. There are around 40 species of migratory birds at the sanctuary, such as the painted stork, spot-billed pelican and white ibis. By the development of bird sanctuary it to leads to job opportunities to local people those are educated and it leads to solve the some unemployed problems.

There are a few other issues in the village that have a negative impact on rural development. The Government of also want to focused on developing rural areas and creating more opportunities.

In this survey I have observed that the villagers have said that they are facing so many problems in the village. They did not have proper road facilities and hospital in the night time. The government was not putting much interest on the development on birds Sanctuary it help them to get tourist and it leads to development of the village.

Problems Identified And Analysis Of The Problems:

The survey shows that how the villagers are facing problems. The ever increasing demand of land both for building and cultivation by the villagers. Change of location of the Zilla Parishad High school which is in the vicinity of Pelicinary.

The unexpected sighting of an otter in the lake waters of the Uppalapadu Bird Sanctuary, on the outskirts of Guntur in Andhra Pradesh recently, has generated excitement among birders, conservationists and the public. The smooth-coated otter, locally called Neeti Kukka or water dog, made its appearance at the end of January this year, at the sanctuary important for the near-threatened spot-billed pelicans. "We have seen that there are about 15 of the otters in the wetland of the sanctuary that spreads across eight to nine acres now,"

Other than this, things that currently economics problems of the population in uppalapadu village are:

- ➤ Low output itself (due to lack of technological intervention, and heavy reliance on monsoon)
- Poor implementation of govt schemes (more than 50% of money is eaten by corrupt middlemen)
- Disconnect with larger market (things are changing now, but only for villages near metro. Remote rural areas still left behind)
- ➤ Disguised unemployment (in farming, more people than needed. Lack of infrastructure for other industries)
- > Lack of necessary facilities like higher education and quality healthcare
- ➤ Less infrastructural facilities such as electricity, roads, water, etc.
- > Little to no real estate value appreciation.

So that to overcome from these problems we need to educate them not only for only reading and writing purpose but also to know and understand them about market, agriculture which is helpful to increase their standard of living

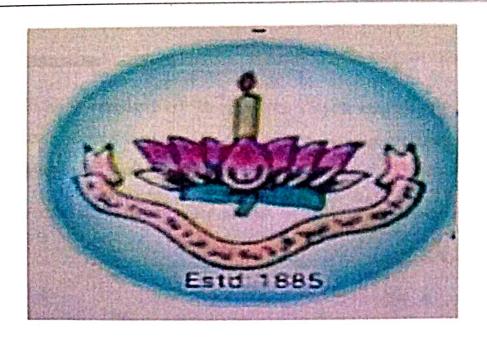

INTRODUCTION

PROTECTION OF WOMEN FROM DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ACT, 2005

The Act ensures women's right to reside in her matrimonial home. This Act has a special feature with specific provisions under law which provide a protection to a women to live in violence free home. Though this Act has civil and criminal provisions, a women victim can get immediate civil remedies within 60 days. Aggrieved women can file cases under this Act against any male adult perpetrator who is in Domestic Relationship with her. They can also include other relatives of the husband and male partner as respondents to seek Remedies in their case.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE ACT:

- Ensures Right to Residence under sec 17.
- Ensures economic relief by recognizing Economic Violence.
- Recognizes verbal and emotional violence.
- Provides temporary custody of child.
- Judgments within 60 days of filing of the case.
- Multiple Judgments in a single case.
- Cases can be filed under PWDV Act even if other Cases are pending between parties.
- Both petitioner and respondent can prefer Appeal.

The violence and fights were so intense and loud that even neighbours got to know about their condition and they also weren't unaware of what was happening in their home. But, there was nothing he could do.

Spousal alone is not something that is faced by only one gender. The general presumption or preconceived nations that have been into our society since bygone is that men are supposed to be strong, mighty and they are generally supposed to bottle up their emotions. If they show or expose their valuembilities then they are labelled as being sissy, effeminate, and many other derogatory terms.

REASON WILY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASES AGAINST MEN GO UNREPORTED

There are many reasons for which many often do not reveal the violence they face by their spouses or by their intimate partners.

- In General stereotypes against males Men often feel discriminated against or feel unasy in opening up about the violence that they face because they feel ashamed that they will be judge and will be labelled as wimpy and effentinate. They think their struggle against violence will go in vain because of gender-specific laws and provisions that are given in the Indian constitution. They feel that they have failed the role of protector in nurturing their families.
- 2. Fear of fake cases Men often feel that revealing the violence can cause unnecessary nuisance and they do not want to face the legal consequences because of the gender-biased or gender-specific laws in our constitution. They feel that they have to leave their families and they don't want to lose custody of their children which is often a cumbersome process.

- 3. Societal and family pressure Most of the Indians continue to live with their families even after their marriage. Because of this factor, men feel ashamed of opening up about the violence. The society also plays a crucial role in nurturing gender baised laws and stereotypes against a particular gender.
- 4. DENIAL Mostly people that domestic violence can only happen to a women. And they live in denial when they get to know that man can also be a victim of domestic violence. So, basically people never really want to talk about it.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic violence is violence or other abuse that occurs in a domestic setting, such as in a marriage or cohabitation. Domestic Violence is often used as synonym for intimate partner violence, which is committed by one of the people in an intimate relationship against the other person, and can take place in relationship or between former spouses or partners. In its broadest sense, Domestic Violence against children, parents, or the elderly. it can assume multiple forms including physical, verbal, emotional, economic, reproductive, or sexual abuse. It can range from subtle ,coercive forms to marital rape and other Violent physical abuse, such as choking, beating, female genital mutilation, and acid throwing that may result in disfigurement or death, and includes the use of technology to harass, control, monitor, stalk or hack.

Domestic murder includes stoning, bride burning, honor killing and dowry death, which sometimes involves non-cohabitating family members. In 2015 the United Kingdom's Home office widened the definition of Domestic Violence to include coercive control.

Domestic Violence often occurs when the abuser believes that they are entitled to it, or that is acceptable justified or unlikely to be reported. It may produce an intergenerational cycle of violence in children and other family members, who may feel that such violence is acceptable or condoned. Many people do not recognize themselves as family conflicts that had gotten out of control. Awareness, perception, definition and documentation of domestic violence differs widely from country to country. Additionally, Domestic Violence often happens in the context of forced or child marriages.

In abusive relationship, there may be a cycle of abuse during which tensions rise and an act of violence is committed, followed by a period of reconciliation and calm. The victims may be trapped in domestically violent situations through isolation, power and control, traumatic bonding to the abuser, cultural acceptance, lack of financial resources, fear and shame or to protect children. As a result of abuse, victims may experience physical disabilities, dysregulate address ion, chronic health problems mental illness, limited finaces, and a poor ability to create healthy relationship, victims may experience severe psychological disorders, such as post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Children who live in a household with violence often show psychological problems from an early age such as avoid ance, hyper vigilance, which may contribute to vicarious dramatization.

In abusive relationships there may be a cycle of abuse during which tension rise and an act of violence is committed, followed by a period of reconciliation and calm.

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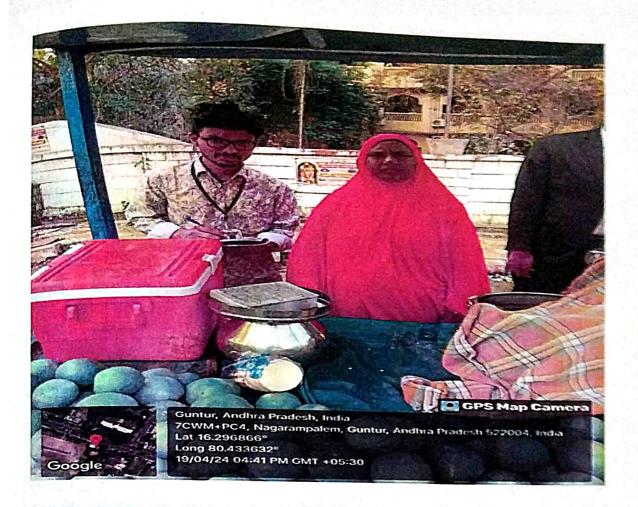

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"VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT PLANS"

i) INTRODUCTION :-

A majority of the villages in the country still face constraints such as access to education, health facilities, drinking water, power, roads, credit, information and market. Against this background, adoption of villages especially in backward regions through preparation of Village Development Plans (VDPs) would go a long way in ensuring holistic and integrated development of the villages concerned.

II) VDP - The Objectives:-

The objective of Village Development Plan is to focus on financial inclusion and also to develop the selected village in an integrated manner. This would include economic development, infrastructure development and other aspects of human development i.e., education, health, drinking water supply, etc., besides access to credit.

(III) Need for an implementing Agency:-

For a holistic and integrated development of a village through synergy and convergence, involvement of various agencies such as Government departments, Panchayati Raj Institutions, Banks, NGOs and other Peoples" Organisations and developmental agencies is considered imperative. In order to synergise and coordinate this process, identification of a nodal agency is considered essential, but not a pre-requisite for implementation of the plan per se; as VDP can also be prepared and implemented by NABARD through its DDM concerned directly.

(IV) Who can become the nodal/implementing agency:-

Any willing Government/Non-government agencies including Agricultural/Rural based Universities, KVKs, Farmers" clubs, SHGs, Village Development Committees, Individual Rural Volunteers (IRVs), Cooperative Societies, Post Offices and bank branches.

(V) Selection of Nodal Agency:-

DDM, NABARD, can either directly take up the VDP or can identify any of the nodal agencies listed above and finalise the same in due consultation with RO, NABARD, concerned. Due care may be taken to ensure that the agency so selected, is locally based and has the capability to mobilize the requisite support from other stakeholders to deliver the intended results.

(VI) Broad Roles and Responsibilities of nodal agency:-

- i. To create awareness in the village and play effective leadership role in building
- ii. People's Organisation/ Groups for various developmental activities.
- iii. To facilitate convergence/integration of various programmes of NABARD, State/Central Government and other agencies in the village.

- advancement with enhanced credit support and financial inclusion of all families in the village.
- v. To identify capacity building needs of the villagers.
- vi. To facilitate improvement in production and productivity under Agriculture

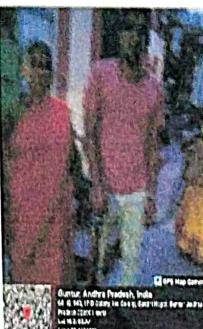

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Abstract:-

Recently, All universities have promoted community service learning program by making it part of the admission process; therefore, students participate in community service learning program to get admission in an institution of their choice. Moreover, after completing the community service program, they see themselves as more socially responsible citizens. This qualitative study aimed to explore the impact of community service learning on the social skills of students. The study employed a qualitative method by randomly selecting twenty five male and female students for focused group interviews from five different O-level Schools situated in a middle socioeconomic locality. The results revealed that community service learning program has a positive impact on the social skills of O-level students. Besides, students had also a positive learning experience. The finding of the study indicated that the awareness to encourage community service in schools is grounded on the acceptance that it does not only give students extra credit points, but serving others or one's own community also makes them better citizens. Based on the advantages and positive experiences of students, the study recommends including a more inclusive model of service learning in college curriculum.

Introduction:-

Previous research suggests that learning through community service develops higher accountability to fulfill social responsibilities and offers students a chance to grow in to a civically engaged environment. The domains of community service learning, community work, civic engagement and voluntary or honorary work with society are becoming more current and famous topics of research studies recently and researchers and educationists have started to realize the importance and psychosocial requirements to give back to the community. The significance of community services or voluntary work related to how people communicate and recognize with other has been well-known. When specific situations or settings are established, letting individuals serve the society and work collectively with each other, pro-social behaviors progress more voluntarily, which expand the overall setting of other relationships in the community (Bond & Smith 1996). The present qualitative research proposes that better contact with diverse groups can decrease prejudice and conflicts, and it provides a platform to understand diversity and pluralism. In our context very little research has been conducted on this topic. Probably, in our context community service learning is a new pedagogy at college level.

The purpose of carrying out this research was to explore the impact of community service learning on the social skills of students. Thus, the research question to guide the study was:

What is the impact of community service program on the social skills of students?

Kohlberg (1971) has defined community service learning as a vital element of social and civic development that forces students to confront social issues. He believes that when people engage in services for others with a new

Way of thinking, people may be persuaded into reasoning at higher levels by reorganizing the way they think about a given situation. Community service engagement at the school level has an informal, but a strong educational objective as it improves students' skills while they serve and enhance their social and civic consciousness. Community service learning can be co- curricular activity or program as it is not mandatory. It is something students do apart from or in addition to their academic studies that plays a vital role in other developmental areas. Rest and Narvaez (1991) have acknowledged community service as a means of promoting social and moral development in the doers. Since the last two decades, community service learning programs have been used as an interesting pedagogy. One of the pedagogies of community service learning projects is youth mentorship programs and it is observed that youth mentoring has a positive impact on students where they have to teach the same age or below age students from the community. Jacoby (1996) opines it is the methodology and teaching technique that relates academic learning and community service so that each supports the other in order to achieve educational goals. Community service learning plays an important role in developing social skills through building qualities of ethical and responsible citizens. In today's world, commercial agendas have influenced a lot of our educational institutions in goal sitting; whereas in the past, the establishment of civic responsibility and its sense in students was one of the main objectives of public education institutions (Sears, 2003).

Previous researches have explored the significance of community service learning within the community and how people need to feel need to feel associated with society by providing specific skills to others (Alder, 1964; Lisman, 1998). Research has also shown the significance of community service in connection to moral values and the development of social skills (Boss, 1994). Adler (1964) describes the importance of volunteering with others for the common good of the community. As a collective society, citizens need to remind themselves to participate in pro-social behaviors for the shared good.

A society is to provide equal opportunity for educational advancement to everyone.

He believes that all individuals within a society have a responsibility to act in socially responsible ways and to participate in critical thinking that will improve the overall quality of human interaction. It is believed that the overall quality of human interaction can be improved through inculcating social skills that can be developed through childhood and nourished by helping others. To help others voluntarily, leads people towards engagement in community service (Dewey, 1916).

Skill Development

With the coming of Globalization and liberalization, new technologies and fast changing markets tend to make existing skills obsolete and require up gradation, new skills and multi-skilling. Globalization often puts a premium on skills requiring high levels of education, often out of the reach of the unorganized sector workers. On the other hand it opens up new markets which workers can reach by adapting existing or traditional skills.

Women workers are usually at the lowest-paid end of any sector, they are usually termed as unskilled, even though very often their work, though low- paid, requires a certain level of technique. Furthermore, many of the skills that women learn are those that are in some way connected to care and reproduction, which are often not regarded as skills at all. For example, some skills which are not recognized now, but which exist with local populations women in forest areas, have a skill of recognizing and using herbal plants. Often a woman's skills may not be regarded as skills at all, either by the person who is documenting the skills, or even by the women themselves. Secondly, the potential marketability of a particular skill is never recognized. This refers to a woman's skills which currently may not being marketed but which may have a good market potential like embroidery or knowledge of herbs. Finally, the 'care' skills of the women can no longer be sidelined. These would include

Knowledge of child-care, care of the sick and particular skills such as mid- wavers. Only then will a measurement of a women's skill will capture the extent of her 'specialization'. One unfortunate tendency that has been noticed in the desperate search for employment that goes on in the unorganized sector is the tendency towards deskilling. Workers lose their traditional or acquired skills when they cannot find employment with these skills.

There is the demand side of the skilling needs which captures the skilling needs at a point in time. Even within the formal sector, there have been rapid changes which have led to changes in demand. The long term strategy should in any case be to inculeate skills in women participate in labor markets as effective employers or entrepreneurs.

The trends and patterns in female employment need to be analyzed in the broader framework of social, cultural and historical specificity. Women's participation in the labor market thus is not only an economic issue but also a larger social question, which demands a multi-disciplinary approach. Women's increased political participation has yielded positive results. First, issues central to development, including health, nutrition, family income





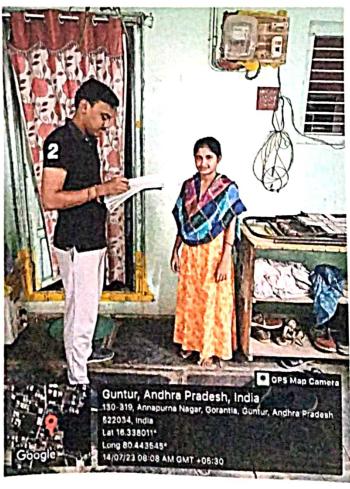

Painted storks, spot-billed pelicans and other birds that migrate from various countries such as Serbia and Australia flock to the Uppalapadu Bird Sanctuary between the months of September and February. There are around 40 species of migratory birds at the sanctuary, such as the painted stork, spot-billed pelican and white ibis. By the development of bird sanctuary it to leads to job opportunities to local people those are educated and it leads to solve the some unemployed problems.

There are a few other issues in the village that have a negative impact on rural development. The Government of also want to focused on developing rural areas and creating more opportunities.

In this survey I have observed that the villagers have said that they are facing so many problems in the village. They did not have proper road facilities and hospital in the night time. The government was not putting much interest on the development on birds Sanctuary it help them to get tourist and it leads to development of the village.

Problems Identified And Analysis Of The Problems:

The unexpected sighting of an otter in the lake waters of the Uppalapadu Bird Sanctuary, on the outskirts of Guntur in Andhra Pradesh recently, has generated excitement among birders, conservationists and the public. The smooth-coated otter, locally called Neeti Kukka or water dog, made its appearance at the end of January this year, at the sanctuary important for the near-threatened spot-billed pelicans. "We have seen that there are about 15 of the otters in the wetland of the sanctuary that spreads across eight to nine acres now,"

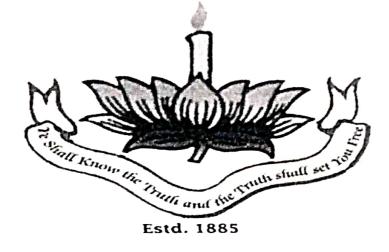

PROTECTION OF WOMEN FROM DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ACT, 2005

The Act ensures women's right to reside in her matrimonial home. This Act has a special feature with specific provisions under law which provide s protection to a women to live in violence free home. Though this Act has civil and criminal provisions, a women victim can get immed inte civil remedies within 60 days. Aggrieved women can file cases under this Act against any male adult perpetrator who is in Domestic Relationship with her. They can also include other relatives of the husband and male partner as respondents to seek Remedies in their case.

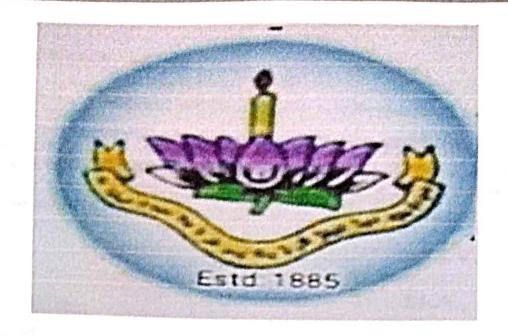

The consistency of result implies that they deserve a high degree of confidence

Hypothesis 1

Physical family violence against women is more prevalent among the lower socioeconomic classes and among women with lower levels of social support .Psychological family violence against women and higher socioeconomic classes.

Hypothesis 2

Family violence against women is more prevalent among families in which the husband uses alcohol. The study did not prove or disprove the related substance abuse hypothesis due to infrequent reporting of husbands who abuse illicit substances.

Hypothesis 3

Family violence aganst women is more prevalent among women who witnessed their father beat their mothers during their childhood than among women who did not witness this parental behaviour.

There are many reasons for which many often do not reveal the violence they face by their spouses or by their intimate partners.

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S.SOCIOTAL and family pressure -Most of the Indians continue to live with their families even after their marriage. Because of this factor, men feel ashamed of opening up about the violence. The society also plays a crucial role in nurturing gender based laws and stereotypes against a particular gender.

4.Denial-Mostly people that domestic violence can only happen to a women.And they like in denial when they get to know that man can also be a victim of domestic violence.So,basically people never really want to talk about it

Role of gender baised laws in making the situations worse

Gender is a social construction and it is often influenced by race, caste, country, class, culture, sexual preference, ability, rituals, etc. In many south Asian countries such as Indian, gender roles are very rigid. The rigidity gives rise to gender baised and stereotypical notions. Men who face domestic violence at the hands of their wives or their intimate partners, these attackers who are usually women are immune to the provisions related to gender violence that is given in penal provisions i.e. Indian penal code of the country.

According to section 498A of the Indian penal code 1860, only a man can be held laible for cruelty to his wife. There is not any subsection or any provision given in the statue that will make a women liable for domestic volence, when men try to open up and to report about the tourture and physical violence that they are facing , no one listens to them, not even the police. complaining about the domestic violence by aman as "effeminate" or "feeble" by the Indian society.

Many men think that situation will get the better shortly because of this reason too they do not report about the domestic violence that they face. Any typeof violence whether physical or mental is the gross violation of human rights. Unreported and unsaid cases of domestic violence can ultimately lead to separation, bitter fights, divorces, depression, and even suciedes.

Because of the baised laws in the Indian penal statue which favourr women ,there are a plethora of false cases where women falsely alleged a man for rape or for domestic violence and the sad thing is that these baised laws automatically assume that a man can never be the victim. Women do not need to give any sort of evidence to prove their authenticity. They are presumed to be true creatures by the baised laws.

According to the 2002 report by the world health organization, women think of committing suicides more often than men while men die of suicides more frequently .Continuous exposure to violence can cause many physical and mental disesase such as dipression ,suicidal tendencies, and czhronic physical disorders such as cancer, heart attacks, HIV/AIDS, etc.

Result of hypothesis testing

The result substances most of the initial study hypothesis related to the women respondent. The exception is the hypothesis that violence is associated with husband's abuse of illicit substance; this could not be elucidated due to inadequate numbers . the study provides evidence for the remaining hypotheses -both in terms of high statiscal association (almost at p<0.001) as well as meaningful differences. The consistency of result implies that they deserve a high degree of confidence

Hypothesis 1

Physical family violence against women is more prevalent among the lower socioeconomic classes and among women with lower levels of social support .Psychological family violence against women and higher socioeconomic classes.

Hypothesis 2

Family violence against women is more prevalent among families in which the husband uses alcohol. The study did not prove or disprove the related substance abuse hypothesis due to infrequent reporting of husbands who abuse illicit substances.

Family violence against women is more prevalent among women who witnessed their father beat their mothers during their childhood than among women who did not witness this parental behaviour.

4. Denial-Mostly people that domestic violence can only happen to a women. And they live in denial when they get to know that man can also be a victim of domestic violence. So, basically, people never really want to talk about it

Role of gender baised laws in making the situations worse

Gender is a social construction and it is often influenced by race, caste, country, class, culture, sexual preference, ability, rituals, etc. In many south Asian countries such as Indian, gender roles are very rigid. The rigidity gives rise to gender baised and stereotypical notions. Men who face domestic violence at the hands of their wives or their intimate partners, these attackers who are usally women are immune to the provisions related to gender violence that is given in penal provisions i.e. Indian penal code of the country.

According to section 498A of the Indian penal code 1860, only a man can be held laible for cruelty to his wife. There is not any subsection or any provision given in the statue that will make a women liable for domestic volence. when men try to open up and to report about the tourture and physical violence that they are facing , no one listens to them, not even the police. complaining about the domestic violence by aman as "effeminate" or "feeble" by the Indian society.

Many men think that situation will get the better shortly because of this reason too they do not report about the domestic violence that they face. Any typeof violence whether physical or mental is the gross violation of human rights. Unreported and unsaid cases of domestic violence can ultimately lead to separation, bitter fights, divorces, depression, and even suciedes.

Domestic violence is violence or other abuse that occurs in a domestic setting ,such as in a marriage or cohabitation .domestic violence is often used as synonym for intimate partner violence, which is committed by one of the people in a intime relationship against the other person, and can take place in relationship or between former spouses or partners in its broadest sense domestic violence against children,parents,or the elderly.it can assume multiple including forms physical, verbal, emotional, economic, reproductive, or sexual abuse it can range from subtle , coercive forms to marital rape and other violent physical abuse, such as choking, beating, female genital mutilation, and acid throwing that may result in disfigurement or death, and includes the use of technology harss, control, monitor, stalk or hack.

Domestic murder includes stoning, bride burning, honor killing and dowry death, which sometimes involves non-cohabitating family members. In 2015 the united kingdom's Home office widened the definition of domestic violence to include coercive control

Domestic violence often occurs when the abuser belives that they are entitled to it,or that is acceptable justified or unlikely to be reported. It may produce an intergenerational cycle of violence in children and other family members, who may feel that such violence is acceptable or condoned. Many people do not recognize themselves as family conflicts that had gotten out of control awareness, perception, definition and documentation of domestic violence differs widely from country to country .Additionly ,domestic violence often happens in the context of forced or child marriages.

In abusive relationship, there may be a cycle of abuse during which tensions rise and an act of violence is committed ,followed by a period of reconciliation and calm . The victims may be trapped in domestically violent situations through isolation ,power and control ,traumatic

bonding to the abuser ,cultural acceptance ,lack of financial resources,fear ,and shame ,or to protect children .As a result of abuse ,victims may experience physical disabilities ,dysregulate addression ,chronic health problems ,mental illess,limited finaces ,and a poor ability to create healthy relationship.victims may experience severe psychological disorders, such as post-traumatic stress disorder(PTSD).Children who live in a household with violence often show psychological problems from an early age ,such as avoidance ,hypervigilance,which may contribute to vicarious traumatization.

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husbands got drunk once a week reported their husbands hit,kicked,or beat them .in addition ,more then half also reported being threatened by the husband (56 percent).

Women's Health

Women's healthwas explored using two indicators a self-assessment of overall health status and the SRQ a self-reporting Questionnaire widely used as a screening test on SRQ were more likely to report boyh physical and psychological violence (being hit husband)compared to women who reported to women reporting their health status as psychological violence were more than twice as likely to score "normal" on the SRQ mental health screening instrument

Woman's childhood experience of family violence

More than one quarter of women reported witnessing their fathers beating their mothers during their childhood.woen living in rural and urban slum areas reported witnessing this parental behaviour more frequently than women living in urban non-slum areas. Harsh physical discipline during childhood was reported by 44 percent of women.similar to the pattern seen with witnessing fathers beating mothers, women living in rural and urban slum areas reported experiencing harsh childhood punishment more commonly than women living in urban non-slum areas.

Women who reported receiving harsh physical discipline as a child were more likely to report physical violence than those who did not by about 7-10percentage points .Of women who were physically dis-.

Result of hypothesis testing

The result substances most of the initial study hypothesis related to the women respondent. The exception is the hypothesis that violence is associated with husband's abuse of illicit substance; this could not be elucidated due to inadequate numbers the study provides evidence for the remaining hypotheses -both in terms of high statiscal association (almost at p<0.001)as well as meaningful differences. The consistency of result implies that they deserve a high degree of confidence

Hypothesis 1

Physical family violence against women is more prevalent among the lower socioeconomic classes and among women with lower levels of social support .Psychological family violence against women and higher socioeconomic classes.

Hypothesis 2

Family violence against women is more prevalent among families in which the husband uses alcohol. The study did not prove or disprove the related substance abuse hypothesis due to infrequent reporting of husbands who abuse illicit substances.

Hypothesis 3

Family violence against women is more prevalent among women who witnessed their father beat their mothers during their childhood than among women who did not witness this parental behaviour.

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3.societal and family pressure -Most of the Indians continue to live with their families even after their marriage. Because of this factor, men feel ashamed of opening up about the violence. The society also plays a crucial role in nurturing gender baised laws and stereotypes against a particular gender.

4. Denial-Mostly people that domestic violence can only happen to a women. And they live in denial when they get to know that man can also be a victim of domestic violence. So, basically, people never really want to talk about it

Role of gender baised laws in making the situations worse

Gender is a social construction and it is often influenced by race, caste, country, class, culture, sexual preference, ability, rituals, etc. In many south Asian countries such as Indian, gender roles are very rigid. The rigidity gives rise to gender baised and stereotypical notions. Men who face domestic violence at the hands of their wives or their intimate partners, these attackers who are usally women are immune to the provisions related to gender violence that is given in penal provisions i.e. Indian penal code of the country.

According to section 498A of the Indian penal code 1860, only a man can be held laible for cruelty to his wife. There is not any subsection or any provision given in the statue that will make a women liable for domestic volence. when men try to open up and to report about the tourture and physical violence that they are facing ,no one listens to them, not even the police. complaining about the domestic violence by aman as "effeminate" or "feeble" by the Indian society.

Many men think that situation will get the better shortly because of this reason too they do not report about the domestic violence that they face. Any typeof violence whether physical or mental is the gross violation of human rights. Unreported and unsaid cases of domestic violence can ultimately lead to separation, bitter fights, divorces, depression, and even suciedes.

Because of the baised laws in the Indian penal statue which favourr women ,there are a plethora of false cases where women falsely alleged a man for rape or for domestic violence and the sad thing is that these baised laws automatically assume that a man can never be the victim. Women do not need to give any sort of evidence to prove their authenticity. They are presumed to be true creatures by the baised laws.

According to the 2002 report by the world health organization, women think of committing suicides more often than men while men die of suicides more frequently .Continuous exposure to violence can cause many physical and mental disesase such as dipression , suicidal tendencies, and czhronic physical disorders such as cancer, heart attacks, HIV/AIDS, etc.

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Conclusion

In recent times due to modernization and westernization, societal values, culture, norms have changed a lot. Earlier men were seen as protectors of their family but nowdays both men and women area lot aare equally working raising and managing their homes and equal contribution to their incomes. Men have now opened up about the domestic violence that they face and now they have started sharing their pian and agony and their struggles openly. Men are no longer stonger than women

It's high time that statue and laws too should recognize their problems as a social problem or issue. Domestic violence against men can be recorganised with effective change in laws, by creating awareness and by breaking stereotypes and preconvinced notions.

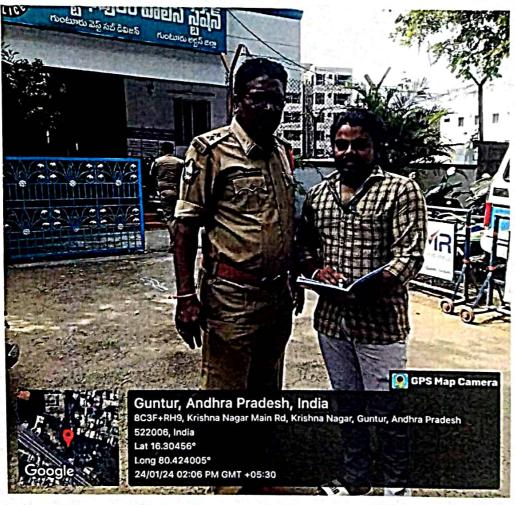

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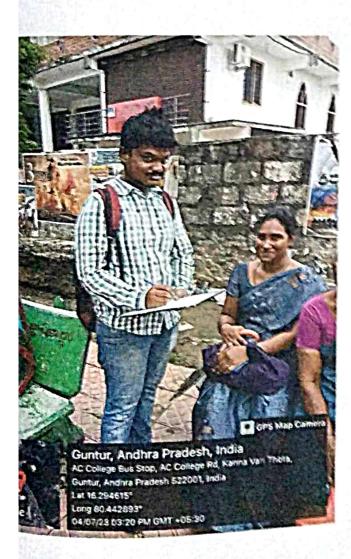
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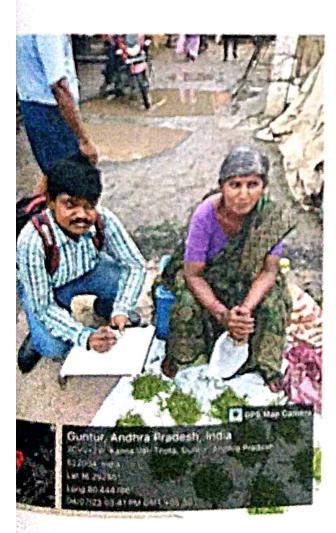

Notable Constitutional, legislative and policy reforms within the last decade, including the 73rd and 74th amendments and the continued administrative decentralization through programs like NRHM, have demonstrated the Government of India's commitment to increasing the political participation of marginalized groups, especially poor women.

Women's increased political participation has yielded positive results. First, issues central to development, including health, nutrition, family income

And education, take center stage as women participate in the PRI, village development boards and other governance structures. Secondly, women have shown that they have critical information about community resources, are adept at managing funds, result in more inclusive governance and learn quickly about how to lead effective community- centered development.

Despite such positive results, women remain largely excluded from the PRI and other local governance structures. Proxy politics, power brokering and gender discrimination continue, and many women Sarpanches have had to face extreme violence for challenging existing societal power centers. In other cases, women are only within the PRI in name, but in reality, it is male family members who hold the power. In spite of the affirmative action in Panchayati raj in favor of marginalized communities, exclusion of caste, poverty, tribal status, gender and caste sharply demarcate those who have political power from those who do not.

Governments at both Centre and State should not delay any further, to complete the devolution and decentralization of powers from higher bodies (Government of India or State Governments) to the panchayati raj structures. This devolution right now is lagging in almost all the States. The three 'F's' - funds, functions and functionaries - in most States are still in the same position prior to 1993, especially the latter. In the absence of this basic requirement, the Constitutional provisions are not only being violated, but there is lack of clarity at the field level which leads to dysfunctional situations. Other program bodies are being referred to as 'parallel' structures and since they are often better trained and energetic, their presence is seen as being "genuine" people's organizations. 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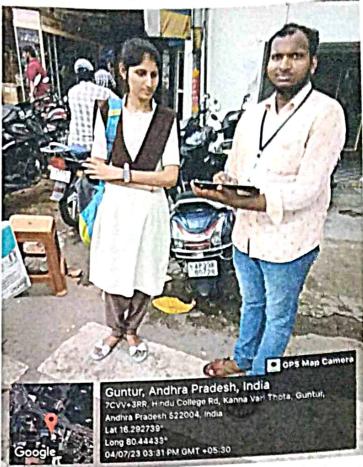


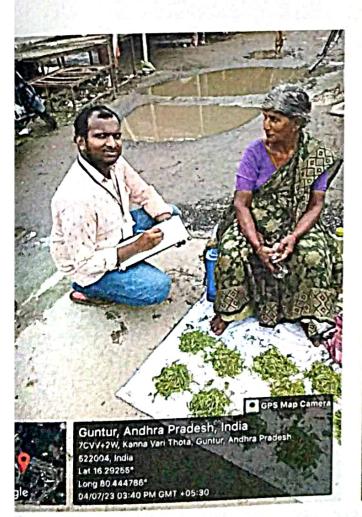

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Introduction CSP:

Introduction on Economics Problems Of The Population In Few Villages:

At present, the condition of the life of the people living in villages is gloomy. The problems of our villagers are many and varied. The villagers are poor, ignorant and superstitious. Most of the villages have no basic amenities like good roads, schools and hospitals. The condition of village schools is not satisfactory. Moreover, the villagers don't understand the importance of education. A large number of children are engaged in economic activities, mainly agriculture. They do not know the laws of health.

Their numbers have been rising rapidly because of the natural increase in population and depeasantization. These workers depend on seasonal demand for labour in agriculture and in rural informal, small-scale industries and services. The landless rural workers are vulnerable to fluctuations in the demand for labour, wage rates, and food prices. They find it even more difficult than small landowners and tenants to gain access to public infrastructure and services. In addition, unlike their counterparts in urban areas, they are often excluded from public sector safety nets (food rations, for example).

Rural areas that lose population face a number of problems. One is a shrinking workforce, making it more difficult for businesses to find workers who match their needs. Another problem is that of an aging population with an increasing need for health services, the provision of which is already a struggle as rural hospitals and other care facilities close.

Then there is the problem of a shrinking tax base, which puts pressure on government budgets to fund essential services, such as infrastructure and public schools, that may help attract businesses and workers. In short, as people leave, the people and businesses that remain are generally worse off.

More recently, rural population loss has become more acute. Between 2010 and 2016, rural areas lost population in absolute terms for the first time. In the past, natural increase more than compensated for the number of people moving from rural areas to urban areas. But declines in the number of births and increases in mortality rates for some rural populations have contributed to a bleaker population outlook for rural communities.

There are around 40 species of migratory birds at the sanctuary, such as the painted stork, spot-billed pelican and white ibis. Recently, All universities have promoted community service learning program by making it part of the admission process; therefore, students participate in community service learning program to get admission in an institution of their choice. Moreover, after completing the community service program, they see themselves as more socially responsible citizens. This qualitative study aimed to explore the impact of community service learning on the social skills of students. The study employed a qualitative method by randomly selecting twenty five male and female students for focused group interviews from five different O-level Schools situated in a middle socioeconomic locality. The results revealed that community service learning program has a positive impact on the social skills of O-level students. Besides, students had also a positive learning experience. The finding of the study indicated that the awareness to encourage community service in schools is grounded on the acceptance that it does not only give students extra credit points, but serving others or one's own community also makes them better citizens. Based on the advantages and positive experiences of students, the study recommends including a more inclusive model of service learning in college curriculum.

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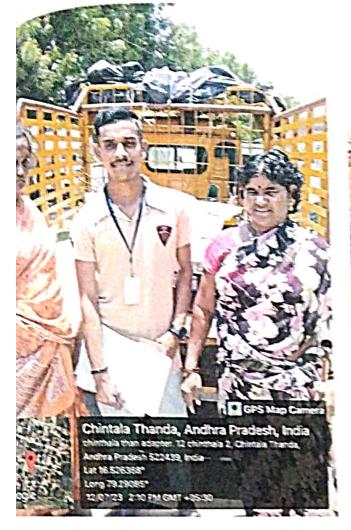
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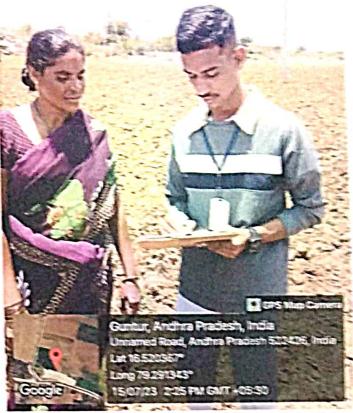

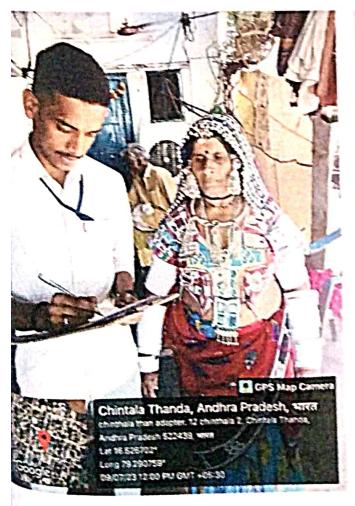
Significance of Community Service Learning in Education

Educational institutions have usually prepared students for the demands of the world by stressing critical thinking and social responsibility of all



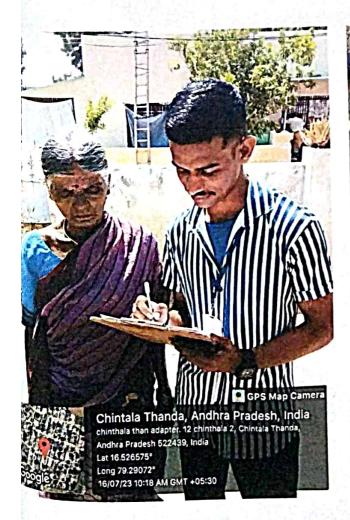

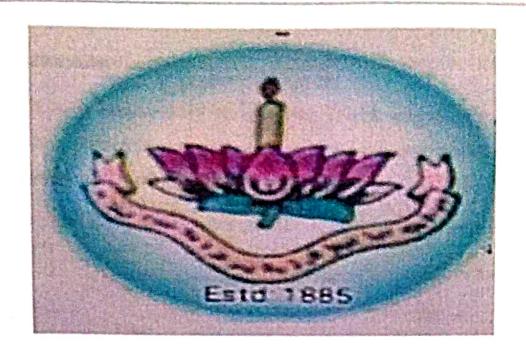

Spousal abuse is not something that is faced by only one gender. The general presumption or preconceived nations that have been into our society since bygone is that men are supposed to be strong, mighty and they are generally supposed to bottle up their emotions. If they show or expose their vulnerabilities then they are labelled as being sissy, effeminate, and many other derogatory terms.

REASON WHY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASES AGAINST MEN GO UNREPORTED

There are many reasons for which many often do not reveal the violence they face by their spouses or by their intimate partners.

- 1. General stereotypes against males Men often feel discriminated against or feel unasy in opening up about the violence that they face because they feel ashamed that they will be judge and will be labelled as wimpy and effeminate. They think their struggle against violence will go in vain because of gender-specific laws and provisions that are given in the Indian constitution. They feel that they have failed the role of protector in nurturing their families.
- 2. Fear of fake cases Men often feel that revealing the violence can cause unnecessary nuisance and they do not want to face the legal consequences because of the gender-biased or gender-specific laws in our constitution. They feel that they have to leave their families and they don't want to lose custody of their children which is often a cumbersome process.

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- 3. Societal and family pressure Most of the Indians continue to live with their families even after their marriage. Because of this factor, men feel ashamed of opening up about the violence. The society also plays a crucial role in nurturing gender baised laws and stereotypes against a particular gender.
- 4. **DENIAL** Mostly people that domestic violence can only happen to a women. And they live in denial when they get to know that man can also be a victim of domestic violence. So, basically people never really want to talk about it.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic violence is violence or other abuse that occurs in a domestic setting, such as in a marriage or cohabitation. Domestic Violence is often used as synonym for intimate partner violence, which is committed by one of the people in an intimate relationship against the other person, and can take place in relationship or between former spouses or partners. In its broadest sense, Domestic Violence against children, parents, or the elderly. it can assume multiple forms including physical, verbal, emotional, economic, reproductive, or sexual abuse. It can range from subtle ,coercive forms to marital rape and other Violent physical abuse, such as choking, beating, female genital mutilation, and acid throwing that may result in disfigurement or death, and includes the use of technology to harass, control, monitor, stalk or hack.

Domestic murder includes stoning, bride burning, honor killing and dowry death, which sometimes involves non-cohabitating family members. In 2015 the United Kingdom's Home office widened the definition of Domestic Violence to include coercive control.

Domestic Violence often occurs when the abuser believes that they are entitled to it, or that is acceptable justified or unlikely to be reported. It may produce an intergenerational cycle of violence in children and other family members, who may feel that such violence is acceptable or condoned. Many people do not recognize themselves as family conflicts that had gotten out of control. Awareness, perception, definition and documentation of domestic violence differs widely from country to country. Additionally, Domestic Violence often happens in the context of forced or child marriages.

In abusive relationship, there may be a cycle of abuse during which tensions rise and an act of violence is committed, followed by a period of reconciliation and calm. The victims may be trapped in domestically violent situations through isolation, power and control, traumatic bonding to the abuser, cultural acceptance, lack of financial resources, fear and shame or to protect children. As a result of abuse, victims may experience physical disabilities, dysregulate address ion, chronic health problems mental illness, limited finaces, and a poor ability to create healthy relationship, victims may experience severe psychological disorders, such as post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Children who live in a household with violence often show psychological problems from an early age such as avoid ance, hyper vigilance, which may contribute to vicarious dramatization.

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WOMEN'S HEALTH

Women's health was explored using two indicators a self-assessment of overall health status and the SRQ a self-reporting Questionnaire widely used as a screening test on SRQ were more likely to report boyh physical and psychological violence (being hit ,kicked,beaten,demeaned,threatened,aband oned,and unfaithfulness of husband)compared to women who reported to women reporting their health status as average or excellent, the converse was also true -women who reported on physical or psychological violence were more than twice as likely to score "normal" on the SRQ mental health screening instrument

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More than one quarter of women reported witnessing their fathers beating their mothers during their childhood.woen living in rural and urban slum areas reported witnessing this parental behaviour more frequently than women living in urban non- slum areas. Harsh physical discipline during childhood was reported by 44 percent of women. Similar to the pattern seen

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Women who reported receiving harsh physical discipline as a child were more likely to report physical violence than those who did not by about 7-10 % point's. of women who were physically disabled.

RESULT OF HYPOTHESIS TESTING

The result substances most of the initial study hypothesis related to the women respondent. The exception is the hypothesis that violence is associated with husband's abuse of illicit substance; this could not be elucidated due to inadequate numbers. The study provides evidence for the remaining hypotheses -both in terms of high statiscal association (almost at p<0.001) as well as meaningful differences. The consistency of result implies that they deserve a high degree of confidence

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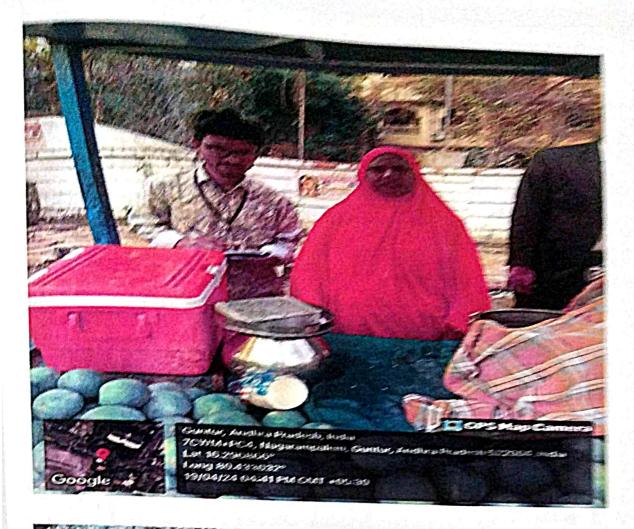
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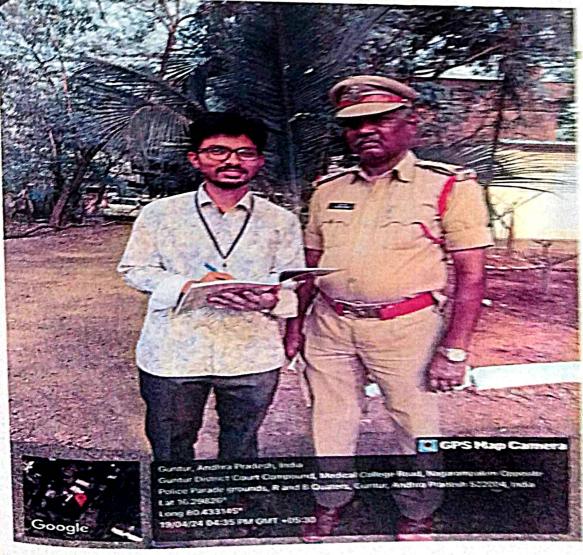

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INTRODUCTION

PROTECTION OF WOMEN FROM DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ACT, 2005

The Act ensures women's right to reside in her matrimonial home. This Act has a special feature with specific provisions under law which provide s protection to a women to live in violence free home. Though this Act has civil and criminal provisions, a women victim can get immed iate civil remedies within 60 days. Aggrieved women can file cases under this Act against any male adult perpetrator who is in Domestic Relationship with her. They can also include other relatives of the husband and male partner as respondents to seek Remedies in their case.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE ACT:

- Ensures Right to Residence under sec 17.
- Ensures economic relief by recognizing Economic Violence.
- Recognizes verbal and emotional violence.
- Provides temporary custody of child.
- > Judgments within 60 days of filing of the case.
- Multiple Judgments in a single case.
- Cases can be filed under PWDV Act even if other Cases are pending between parties.
- Both petitioner and respondent can prefer Appeal.

Mahesh was beaten an trouted by his wife daily in front of his son. His son's behavior was also getting affected of daily nuisance and violence in the home. The violence and fights were so intense and loud that even neighbours got to know about their condition and they also weren't unaware of what was happening in their home. But, there was nothing he could do.

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One day when, Mahesh hanged himself from the ceiling fan because he was done with the never-ending violence.

Spousal abuse is not something that is faced by only one gender. The general presumption or preconceived nations that have been into our society since bygone is that men are supposed to be strong, mighty and they are generally supposed to bottle up their emotions. If they show or expose their vulnerabilities then they are labelled as being sissy, effeminate, and many other derogatory terms.

REASON WHY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASES AGAINST MEN GO UNREPORTED

There are many reasons for which many often do not reveal the violence they face by their spouses or by their intimate partners.

- 1. General stereotypes against males Men often feel discriminated against or feel unasy in opening up about the violence that they face because they feel ashamed that they will be judge and will be labelled as wimpy and effeminate. They think their struggle against violence will go in vain because of gender-specific laws and provisions that are given in the Indian constitution. They feel that they have failed the role of protector in nurturing their families.
- 2. Fear of fake cases Men often feel that revealing the violence can cause unnecessary nuisance and they do not want to face the legal consequences because of the gender-biased or gender-specific laws in our constitution. They feel that they have to leave their families and they don't want to lose custody of their children which is often a cumbersome process.

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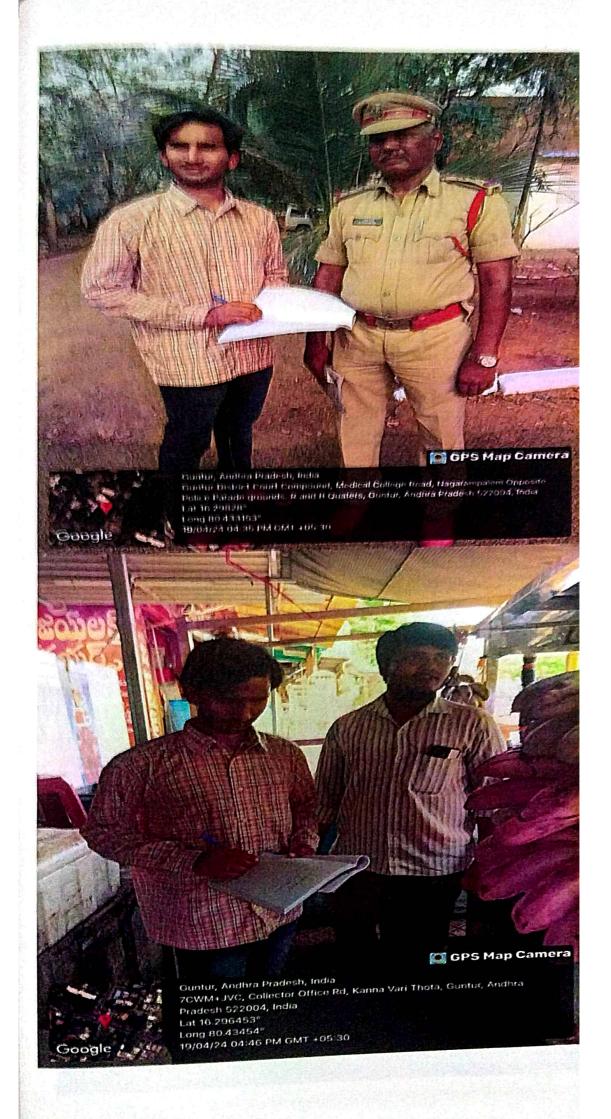
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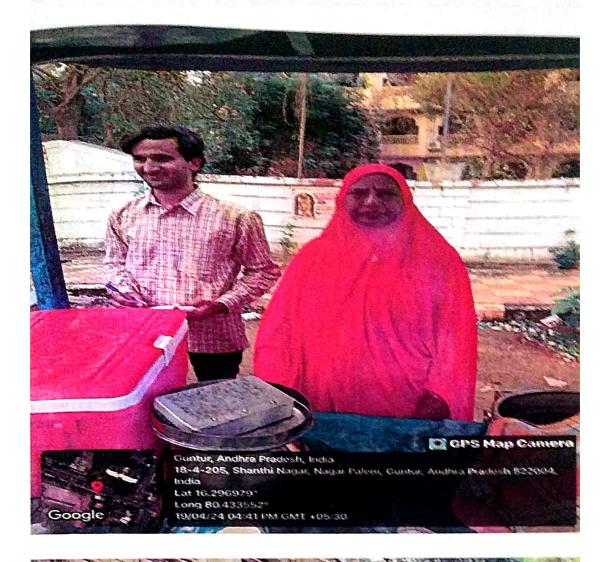
- 3. Societal and family pressure Most of the Indians continue to live with their families even after their marriage. Because of this factor, men feel ashamed of opening up about the violence. The society also plays a crucial role in nurturing gender baised laws and stereotypes against a particular gender.
- 4. DENIAL Mostly people that domestic violence can only happen to a women. And they live in denial when they get to know that man can also be a victim of domestic violence. So, basically people never really want to talk about it.

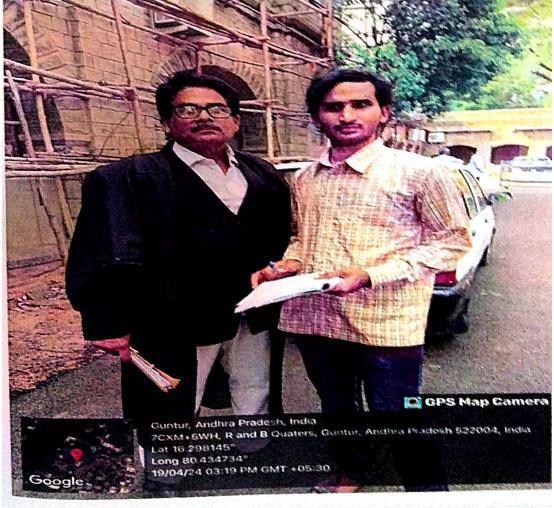
DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic violence is violence or other abuse that occurs in a domestic setting, such as in a marriage or cohabitation. Domestic Violence is often used as synonym for intimate partner violence, which is committed by one of the people in an intimate relationship against the other person, and can take place in relationship or between former spouses or partners. In its broadest sense, Domestic Violence against children, parents, or the elderly. it can assume multiple forms including physical, verbal, emotional, economic, reproductive, or sexual abuse. It can range from subtle ,coercive forms to marital rape and other Violent physical abuse, such as choking, beating, female genital mutilation, and acid throwing that may result in disfigurement or death, and includes the use of technology to harass, control, monitor, stalk or hack.

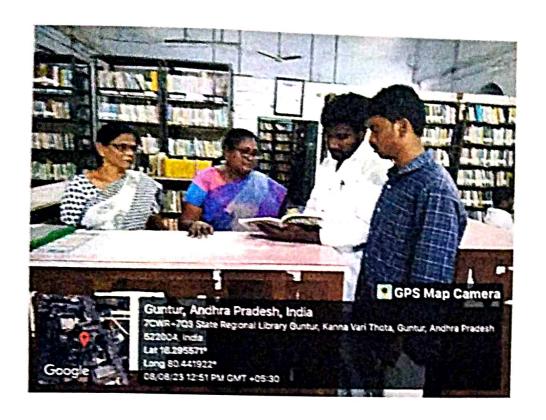

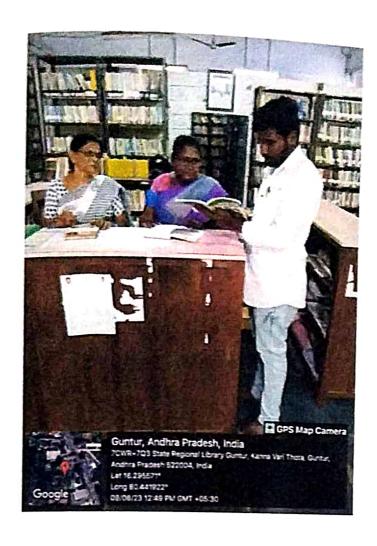

INTRODUCTION

PROTECTION OF WOMEN FROM DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ACT, 2005

The Act ensures women's right to reside in her matrimonial home. This Act has a special feature with specific provisions under law which provide s protection to a women to live in violence free home. Though this Act has civil and criminal provisions, a women victim can get immed into civil remedies within 60 days. Aggrieved women can file cases under this Act against any male adult perpetrator who is in Domestic Relationship with her. They can also include other relatives of the husband and male partner as respondents to seek Remedies in their case.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE ACT:

- Ensures Right to Residence under sec 17.
- Ensures economic relief by recognizing Economic Violence.
- Recognizes verbal and emotional violence.
- Provides temporary custody of child.
- > Judgments within 60 days of filing of the case.
- Multiple Judgments in a single case.
- Cases can be filed under PWDV Act even if other Cases are pending between parties.
- > Both petitioner and respondent can prefer Appeal.

Mahesh was beaten an trouted by his wife daily in front of his son. His son's behavior was also getting affected of daily nuisance and violence in the home. The violence and fights were so intense and loud that even neighbours got to know about their condition and they also weren't unaware of what was happening in their home. But, there was nothing he could do.

One day when, Mahesh hanged himself from the ceiling fan because he was done with the never-ending violence.

Spousal abuse is not something that is faced by only one gender. The general presumption or preconceived nations that have been into our society since bygone is that men are supposed to be strong, mighty and they are generally supposed to bottle up their emotions. If they show or expose their vulnerabilities then they are labelled as being sissy, effeminate, and many other derogatory terms.

REASON WHY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASES AGAINST MEN GO UNREPORTED

There are many reasons for which many often do not reveal the violence they face by their spouses or by their intimate partners.

- 1. General stereotypes against males Men often feel discriminated against or feel unasy in opening up about the violence that they face because they feel ashamed that they will be judge and will be labelled as wimpy and effeminate. They think their struggle against violence will go in vain because of gender-specific laws and provisions that are given in the Indian constitution. They feel that they have failed the role of protector in nurturing their families.
- 2. Fear of fake cases Men often feel that revealing the violence can cause unnecessary nuisance and they do not want to face the legal consequences because of the gender-biased or gender-specific laws in our constitution. They feel that they have to leave their families and they don't want to lose custody of their children which is often a cumbersome process.

- 3. Societal and family pressure Most of the Indians continue to live with their families even after their marriage. Because of this factor, men feel ashamed of opening up about the violence. The society also plays a crucial role in nurturing gender baised laws and stereotypes against a particular gender.
- 4. **DENIAL** Mostly people that domestic violence can only happen to a women. And they live in denial when they get to know that man can also be a victim of domestic violence. So, basically people never really want to talk about it.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic violence is violence or other abuse that occurs in a domestic setting, such as in a marriage or cohabitation. Domestic Violence is often used as synonym for intimate partner violence, which is committed by one of the people in an intimate relationship against the other person, and can take place in relationship or between former spouses or partners. In its broadest sense, Domestic Violence against children, parents, or the elderly. it can assume multiple forms including physical, verbal, emotional, economic, reproductive, or sexual abuse. It can range from subtle ,coercive forms to marital rape and other Violent physical abuse, such as choking, beating, female genital mutilation, and acid throwing that may result in disfigurement or death, and includes the use of technology to harass, control, monitor, stalk or hack.

Domestic murder includes stoning, bride burning, honor killing and dowry death, which sometimes involves non-cohabitating family members. In 2015 the United Kingdom's Home office widened the definition of Domestic Violence to include coercive control.

Domestic Violence often occurs when the abuser believes that they are entitled to it, or that is acceptable justified or unlikely to be reported. It may produce an intergenerational cycle of violence in children and other family members, who may feel that such violence is acceptable or condoned. Many people do not recognize themselves as family conflicts that had gotten out of control. Awareness, perception, definition and documentation of domestic violence differs widely from country to country. Additionally, Domestic Violence often happens in the context of forced or child marriages.

In abusive relationship, there may be a cycle of abuse during which tensions rise and an act of violence is committed, followed by a period of reconciliation and calm. The victims may be trapped in domestically violent situations through isolation, power and control, traumatic bonding to the abuser, cultural acceptance, lack of financial resources, fear and shame or to protect children. As a result of abuse, victims may experience physical disabilities, dysregulate address ion, chronic health problems mental illness, limited finaces, and a poor ability to create healthy relationship, victims may experience severe psychological disorders, such as post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Children who live in a household with violence often show psychological problems from an early age such as avoid ance, hyper vigilance, which may contribute to vicarious dramatization.

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As result of abuse. physical victims experience may disabilities, dysregulated aggression, chronic health problems, mental illness, limited finace, and healthy poor ability to create relationships. Victims may experience severe psychological disorders , such post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), children who live in a as household with violence often show psychological problems from an early age such as avoidance, hyper vigilance to threats and dysregulated aggression, which may contribute to vicarious traumatization husbands got drunk once a week reported their husbands hit, kicked, or beat them. In addition, more than half also reported being threatened by the husband (56 percent).

WOMEN'S HEALTH

Women's health was explored using two indicators a self-assessment of overall health status and the SRQ a self-reporting Questionnaire widely used as a screening test on SRQ were more likely to report boyh physical and psychological violence (being hit ,kicked,beaten,demeaned,threatened,aband oned,and unfaithfulness of husband)compared to women who reported to women reporting their health status as average or excellent, the converse was also true -women who reported on physical or psychological violence were more than twice as likely to score "normal" on the SRQ mental health screening instrument

WOMAN'S CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCE OF FAMILY VIOLENCE

More than one quarter of women reported witnessing their fathers beating their mothers during their childhood.woen living in rural and urban slum areas reported witnessing this parental behaviour more frequently than women living in urban non- slum areas. Harsh physical discipline during childhood was reported by 44 percent of women. Similar to the pattern seen

with witnessing fathers beating mothers, women living in rural and urban slum areas reported experiencing harsh childhood punishment more commonly than women living in urban non-slum areas.

Women who reported receiving harsh physical discipline as a child were more likely to report physical violence than those who did not by about 7-10 % point's. of women who were physically disabled.

RESULT OF HYPOTHESIS TESTING

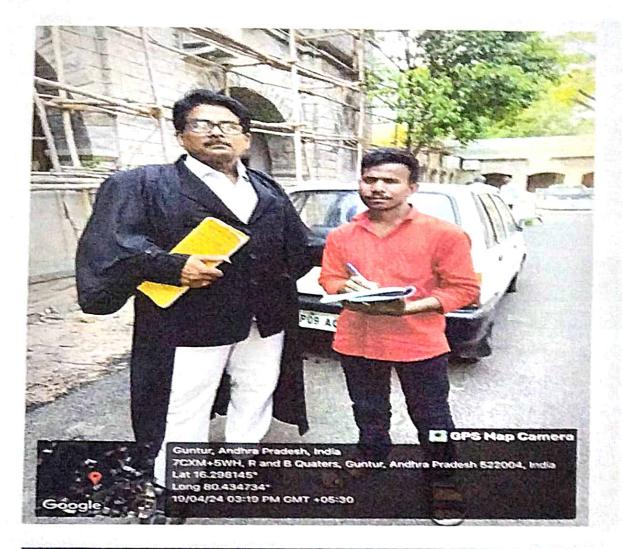
The result substances most of the initial study hypothesis related to the women respondent. The exception is the hypothesis that violence is associated with husband's abuse of illicit substance; this could not be elucidated due to inadequate numbers. The study provides evidence for the remaining hypotheses -both in terms of high statiscal association (almost at p<0.001) as well as meaningful differences. The consistency of result implies that they deserve a high degree of confidence

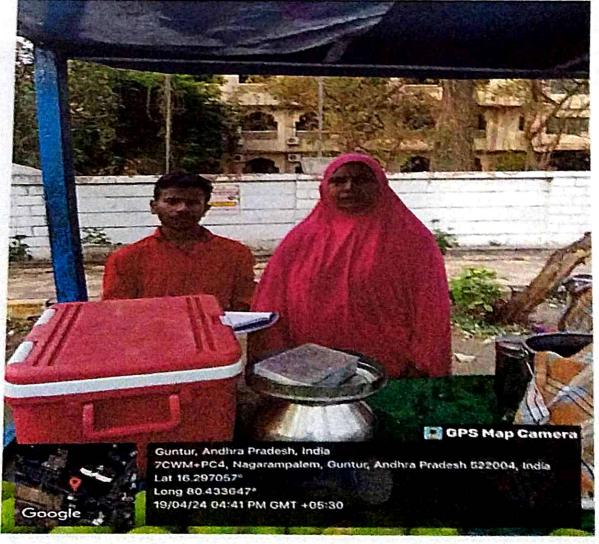
HYPOTHESIS 1

Physical family violence against women is more prevalent among the lower socio-economic classes and among women with lower levels of social support. Psychological family violence against women and higher socio-economic classes.

HYPOTHESIS 2

Family violence against women is more prevalent among families in which the husband uses alcohol. The study did not prove or disprove the related substance abuse hypothesis due to infrequent reporting of husbands who abuse illicit substances.
