Seminar Report on "Group Theory: Kernel of a Homomorphism, Fundamental Theorem of Homomorphisms and its Applications"

Introduction

The Department of Mathematics, Andhra Christian College, Guntur, organized a seminar on "Group Theory: Kernel of a Homomorphism, Fundamental Theorem of Homomorphisms and its Applications" on 22-08-2022. The seminar was graced by the presence of Mr. S. M. Subhani, Head, Department of Mathematics, St. Ann's Degree College for Women, Gorantla, Guntur, who served as the resource person.

Objectives of the Seminar

After that he focused on the applications of the kernel of a homomorphism and the fundamental theorem of homomorphisms. Mr. Subhani discussed how these concepts are utilized in various areas of Mathematics and other disciplines.

Key Points Covered:

- Applications in solving polynomial equations.
- Use in cryptography and coding theory.
- Applications in symmetry and physics.
- Real-world problems where group theory plays a crucial role.

Interactive Session



Conclusion


