Since the formation of NSS in 1969, the number of students has increased from 40,000 to over 3.8 million up to the end of March 2018.

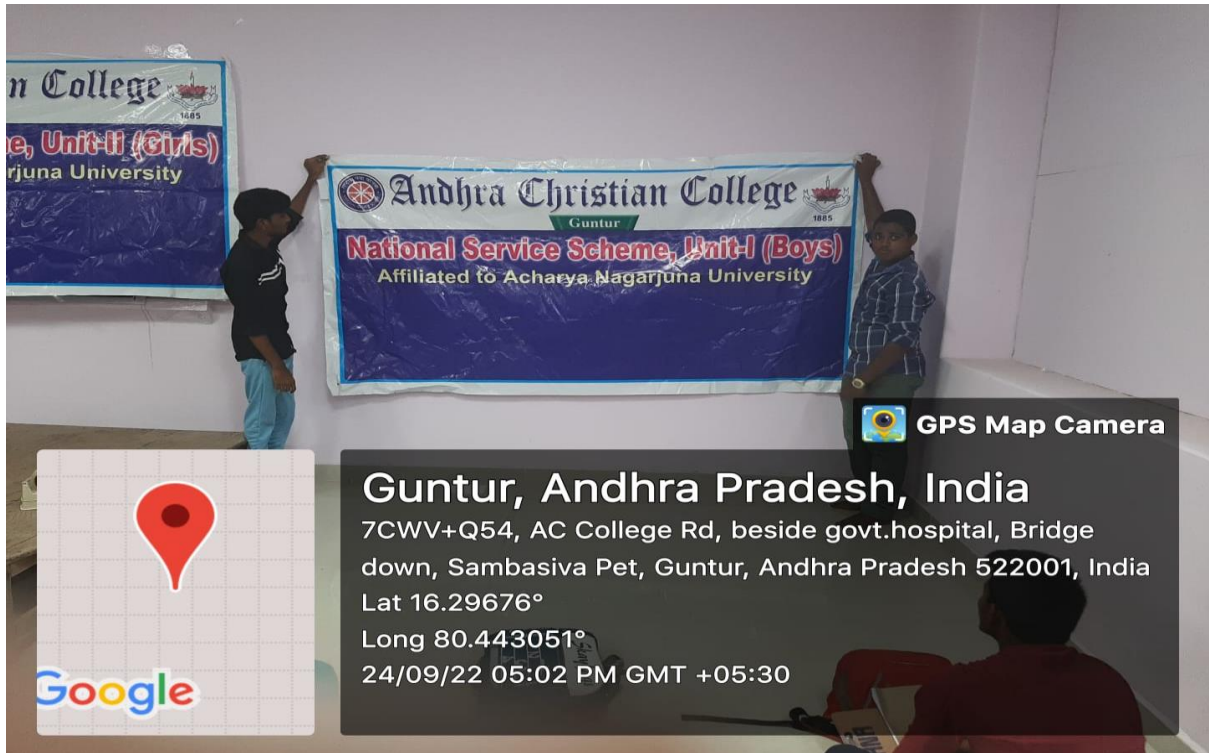

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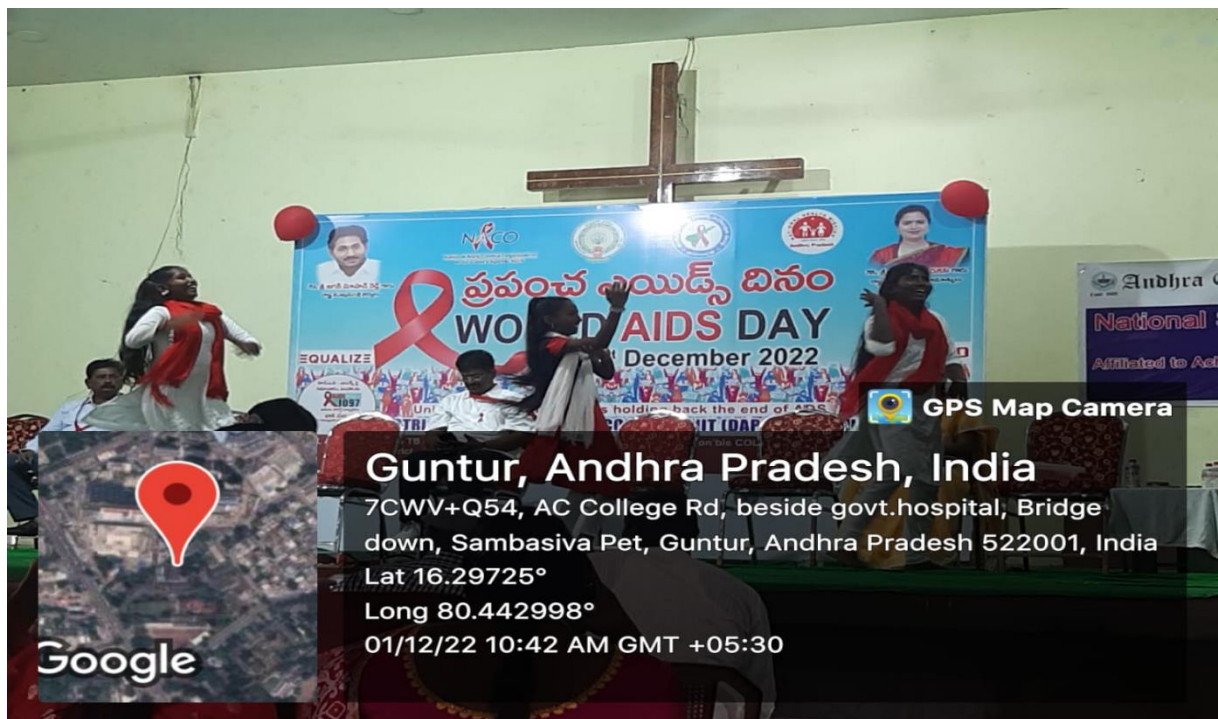

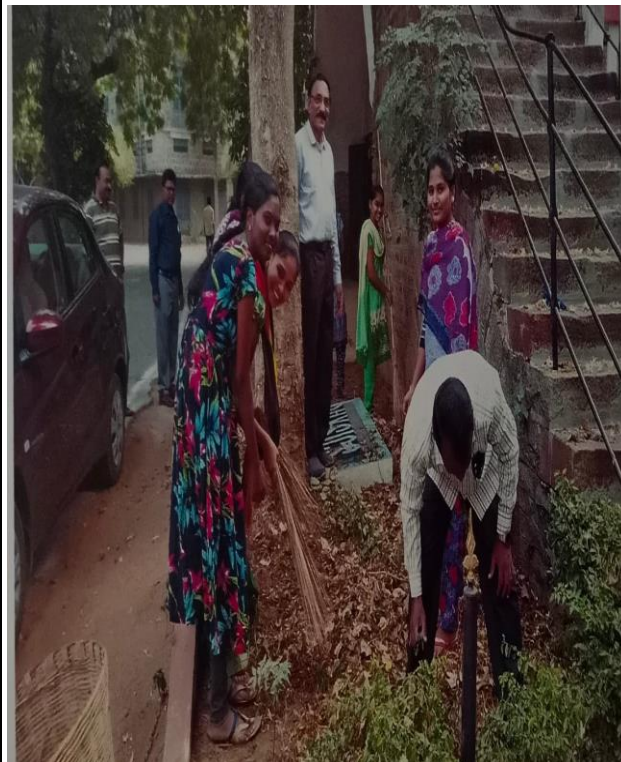
